Research Goal

We are seeking participants for a ground-breaking study of gay father families who have a child born via surrogacy. Who can Participate

To be eligible to participate in this study you must be at least 18 years old and be in a current couple relationship with the partner/spouse you originally planned to coparent with. Your child must fit the following characteristics for this particular research:

- Born via surrogacy
- Now between the ages of 3 and 10
- Not one of multiple births (for example, not a twin or triplet)
- Genetically related to ONE of the fathers in the couple relationship (one of the dads was the sperm provider)

We are asking that the "PRIMARY" caregiving parent be the person to fill out the survey. By "primary caregiving parent" we mean the parent who has spent the most time with the child and carried most of the responsibility for taking care of the child overall since birth. If both parents spend an equal amount of time in this role, then you can either flip a coin or self-select who will serve as the parent participant for this study. Because the survey is in English, participating parents will need to be able to read and write English in order to complete the survey.
